Chameleon Arts Ensemble Announces 25th Anniversary Season Programs

August 2, 2022 – Boston, MA – The Chameleon Arts Ensemble is pleased to announce its 25th anniversary season programs.

Since its debut in 1998, Chameleon has built a reputation as Boston's most adventurous chamber ensemble, integrating old and new repertoire into unexpected chamber music programs that are themselves works of art. The Ensemble has received extensive critical acclaim for its world-class performances, the staggering array of works it has presented, and for the enduring and innovative programming of Artistic Director, Deborah Boldin – transforming the listening experience by exploring both the rich tradition and the continual evolution of the chamber music art form. Ms. Boldin notes: "I'm very proud of Chameleon's unmatched legacy of adventurous programming and what we have achieved over the past 25 years. Reaching this milestone is, by any measure, a significant achievement for a small arts organization and we are looking forward to a season filled with joy and celebration."

The 2022-2023 **chamber music series** includes six vibrant and innovative programs at First Church in Boston, 66 Marlborough Street. Concerts are on Saturday evenings at 8 PM and Sunday afternoons at 4 PM, on October 1 and 2, October 29 and 30, and November 19 and 20, 2022, and continuing on March 4 and 5, April 1 and 2, and May 20 and 21, 2023 at First Church in Boston, 66 Marlborough Street. The 2023 **Chameleon Up Close** recital series includes performances on March 19 and April 30 at the Goethe-Institut, Boston, 170 Beacon Street.

Chameleon's exceptional, multi-generational roster of **artists** was called "an all-star lineup of chamber musicians" by *The Boston Globe*, and individually, they have appeared in concert around the world with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, Marlboro Music, Boston Symphony, Chamber Music Northwest, Music@Menlo, and the Verbier, Ravinia, and Caramoor Festivals, among others. *The Boston Musical Intelligencer* hailed "One sensed that all the Chameleons were born for chamber music," and *The Boston Classical Review* commented "This was playing of the highest kind."

2022-2023 CHAMBER MUSIC SERIES

Chameleon opens its 25th anniversary season with *Vienna Dreams* on Saturday, October 1, 8 PM and Sunday, October 2, 4 PM at First Church in Boston. The program explores chapters in Viennese musical history and their continuing influences today. It includes Mozart's Quartet in D

Major for flute and strings, K. 285; selections from Arnold Schoenberg's *Das Buch der hängenden Gärten* for soprano and piano, Op. 15; and Brahms' Piano Quartet No. 2 in A Major, Op. 26, alongside two homages: Aaron Jay Kernis' *Mozart en Route (or, A Little Traveling Music)* for string trio and Elliott Schwartz's *Vienna Dreams* for clarinet, viola, and piano.

Gods and Monsters on Saturday October 29, 8 PM and Sunday October 30, 4 PM at First Church in Boston, is a whimsically themed program of high drama and wild fantasy. The concerts are bookended by the master of fantasy, Robert Schumann, including his Fantasiestücke for clarinet and piano, Op. 73 and Piano Trio No. 3 in g minor. In between are Cynthia Lee Wong's Piano Quartet inspired by Edgar Allan Poe; Andre Caplet's Conte fantastique d'après "Le Masque de la Mort Rouge" for harp and string quartet; and Andrew List's The Gargoyles of Notre Dame for flute, clarinet, string trio, piano, and percussion.

On Saturday, November 19, 2022, 8 PM and Sunday, November 20, 2022, 4 PM at First Church in Boston we celebrate 25 years with the original "Chameleon" ensemble of variable instrumentation, virtuosity, and color: The Complete Brandenburg Concertos, BWV 1046–1051 of J.S. Bach.

The Bard takes center stage for our first program of 2023 with *How silver-sweet sound* on **Saturday, March 4, 8 PM and Sunday, March 5, 4 PM** at First Church in Boston. The program is studded with Shakespeare-inspired works including Erich Korngold's Suite from *Much Ado About Nothing* for violin and piano, Op. 11; David Matthews' cycle on texts from *Antony and Cleopatra*, titled *Terrible Beauty* for soprano, flute, clarinet, harp, and string quartet, Op. 104; and Thomas Adès' *Court Studies* from *The Tempest* for clarinet, violin, cello, and piano. Rounding out the program are Ralph Vaughan Williams' *Six Studies in English Folk Song* for English horn and piano and Edward Elgar's 1918 Piano Quintet in a minor, Op. 84.

Fêtes galantes on Saturday, April 1, 2023, 8 PM and Sunday, April 2, 2023, 4 PM at First Church in Boston brings together rhapsody and reverie, dreams and magic. It includes Claude Debussy's Première rhapsodie for clarinet and piano; Helen Grime's take on the commedia dell'arte, *Pierrot Miniatures* for flute, clarinet, violin, viola, cello, and piano; Gabriel Fauré's Mélodies "de Venise" for soprano and piano, Op. 58; Andrea Clearfield's *Unremembered Wings* for oboe and piano; and Mendelssohn's sparkling chamber concerto, the Sextet for piano, violin, two violas, cello, and double bass, Op. 110.

We close our 25th chamber music series on **Saturday, May 20, 2023, 8 PM and Sunday, May 21, 2023, 4 PM** at First Church in Boston. The program, titled *Diversions & Entertainments*, offers a giant dose of joy by way of Schubert's beloved Octet in F Major, D. 803, Op. 166; Paul Hindemith's Kleine Kammermusik for wind quintet, Op. 24, No. 2; John Musto's captivating Divertimento for flute, clarinet, viola, cello, piano, and percussion; and the g minor Fantasie for violin and piano by Florence Price.

RECITAL SERIES - CHAMELEON UP CLOSE

Our recital series gives audiences members the opportunity to see and hear Chameleon's superb artists in an informal and "up close" way. *The Boston Musical Intelligencer* praised "the artfully chosen works," hailed "the two stars treated us to a thrilling performance," and noted "one felt charmed even before a sound was produced." This year's series will take place at the Goethe-

Institut, Boston, transformed into an intimate cabaret setting. The programs are hosted by Artistic Director Deborah Boldin and feature our hallmark mix of classic, neglected and contemporary works.

On Sunday, March 19, 2023 at 4 PM at Goethe-Institut, Boston, pianists Mika Sasaki and Elizabeth Schumann share an enchanting program titled *Once upon a time...* The program features two four-hand arrangements (by the composers) of their ballet music – Ravel's *Ma mère l'Oye* and Stravinsky's *Petrushka* – along with Mozart's youthful Sonata in D Major for piano four hands, K. 381 and George Crumb's exploration of the solar system, "Alpha Centauri" from *Celestial Mechanics, Makrokosmos IV. The Boston Musical Intelligencer* praised Ms. Sasaki's "colorful reading...[with] nuance and sensitivity." *The Washington Post* described Ms. Schumann as "deft, relentless, and devastatingly good."

Up Close 2 on **Sunday, April 30, 2023 at 4 PM** at Goethe-Institut, Boston, explores the boundaries of expression and features violinist Francesca dePasquale, clarinetist Gary Gorczyca, and pianist Vivian Chang-Freiheit. *The Strad* praised Ms. dePasquale's "immaculate and discreet phrasing," and *The Boston Globe* praised Mr. Gorczyca's "profound expressivity." *The Boston Musical Intelligencer* noted Ms. Chang-Freiheit was "soulful, passionate, playful, delicate, and her sense of ensemble brilliant." The program includes *the* 20th century classic for the combination – Bartók's *Contrasts*, Sz. 111, BB 116 – along with Sebastian Currier's *On the Verge* for clarinet, violin, and piano; Schumann's Violin Sonata No. 1 in a minor, Op. 105; Carl Reinecke's Fantasiestücke for clarinet and piano, Op. 22; and Estonian composer Helena Tulva's evocative *Saar* (Island) for clarinet and violin.
