The program is interactive and intended for children of all ages and their families. An instrument "petting zoo" will follow the concert. Children will be able to handle and play percussion, violin, viola, cello, and double bass as guided by Chameleon's musicians, and will be encouraged to touch, pluck, bow, and strike.
